

#### Antiviral substances discovered within native plants in South Korea

## New platform for electronic Mach-Zehnder interferometer

Hybrid graphene structures consisting of two different areas of graphene layers, e.g., partly monolayer graphene (MLG) and partly bilayer graphene (BLG), present a lot of interesting physics. For example, the Hall resistance across such graphene hybrid structures shows quantized plateaus switching between those of MLG or BLG quantum Hall plateaus depending on the type of
